





# **GLOBAL HEALTH TRUE LEADERS 2.0**



## GENERAL DESCRIPTION



Global Health True Leaders (GHTL) training was introduced in 2014 and successfully conducted in eight batches in four countries (Indonesia, Thailand, Vietnam and China). There are more than 500 alumni in 10 countries including Indonesia, Malaysia, Vietnam, Thailand, Philippines, Lao PDR, Cambodia, China, Nepal, and Myanmar. The alumni encompasses students, medical doctors, veterinarians, NGO staff, lecturers, researchers, associate professors, managers, government officers as well as young public health practitioners.



Global Health True Leaders (GHTL) is a training on leadership and multisectoral collaboration, designed to equip the participants with One Health knowledge and skills to strengthen health systems and health outcomes. Not only do the participants work together with selected fellow young leaders from various disciplines and countries but they also will work together to solve global health challenges and problems through cultural understanding.

# PROGRAM OUTCOME



- 1. Introducing the concept of One Health problem solving which combines public health, veterinary health, and environmental health training
- 2. To increase the knowledge of participants about the approaches to One Health and global issues surrounding them
- 3. To build participants' cultural awareness and understanding
- 4. To improve participants' skill in formulating an accessible disease management control program





### GLOBAL HEALTH AND LEADERSHIP TRAINING

he participants will be receive in depth analysis and conceptualized work about global issues and challenges by international and national experts. It will focus on issues that have a strong interconnection towards the subjects of animal health, human health, and environmental health. These sessions not only aim to have participants grasp a greater understanding of global issues, but they will also learn about how to detect, respond, and prevent problems together across disciplines.



#### SIMULATION AND DISCUSSION

Trainings will be interactive in which the participants will perform exercises after public lectures. The exercises are various in nature ranging to role play, social communication practice, to public speaking simulation. This is so participants can improve their skills to in speaking and sharing their ideas. To further train participants to respond to dynamics, they will have many roles which have different responsible in different cases.



#### LOCAL UNDERSTANDING AND EMPOWERMENT

ollowing activities done in a classroom setting, participants will exercise their knowledge and skills to the real conditions in local areas.

Participants will have a chance to do fieldwork activity to improve their understanding about culture and implement the knowledge that have been discussed. Participants will visit local communities to live with them directly experience a different culture.



#### CULTURAL EXCHANGE

articipants will have an opportunity build to their cross cultural awareness skill. Essentially, it means that, as you go about your daily life, you operate with the awareness that cultural differences between yourself and the people you meet exist without assigning them value. You see our differences as a positive thing, and don't consider one culture better or worse, right or wrong.



#### REGULAR MORNING EXERCISE WITH INDONESIA ARMY OR INDONESIA POLICE

very morning during training period, participants have to join morning exercises with personnel from the Indonesia Army or the Indonesian Police. This was designed to develop and build healthy lifestyle especially for future leaders who need to respond with tight schedules and close deadlines.



#### TEAM BUILDING ACTIVITY

s a global citizen, socializing and making friends anywhere is one of the best ways to increase productivity. Not only does it increase understanding of different cultures and perspective, it also allows a more modern approach to work that can develop new measures to tackle global health issues. Thus, it can spur good communication and apt collaboration skills in the future whilst fostering creativity and innovation within the workforce.



#### YOUTH HEALTH INITIATIVE

fter training, participants will be given a chance to initiate a program to empower the local community. They will promote human, animal, and environment health and its interaction in the local area. It will encourage them to implement their knowledge about One Health.
